

VIRTUAL TRAINING

INDIAN HOUSING PLAN/ANNUAL PERFORMANCE REPORT

June 2-3, 2020 | 9:00 am – 4:00 pm Pacific Daylight Time

OVERVIEW

Successful submission of an Indian Housing Plan (IHP) and an Annual Performance Report (APR) is a compliance requirement for all Indian tribes and Alaska Native villages that are eligible recipients under the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (NAHASDA) Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG) program. The IHP indentifies need and describes the recipient's plans for using the IHBG to carry out eligible housing activities. The APR describes progress made toward meeting the IHP goals and demonstrates financial accountability.

Due to the current coronavirus pandemic, this training is being offering virtually.

INSTRUCTIONS AND MATERIALS

Instructions on how to access the virtual training and a link to electronic materials will be emailed by Friday, May 29, 2020.

TECHNOLOGY NEEDED

The training will be presented via an online platform. Participants will need a smart device (computer, laptop, tablet, or phone) with internet or WiFi connection. A web camera is not required but will be utilized if available.

TRAINING

During this 2-day virtual training, participants will receive step-bystep instruction on how to successfully complete the combined, automated IHP/APR form. The trainer will provide a walk-through of EPIC, the system for submitting the IHP/APR. Participants will also receive guidance on the development, planning, and reporting processes and requirements. All grantees are encouraged to attend this training.
